SBCT Updates

Legislative Updates

- 2SSB 5331 is awaiting the Governor's signature. We are thrilled to see that the Early Childhood Program bill has passed out of the legislature and has made it to Governor Inslee's desk! Final amendments were incorporated to strengthen the bill's focus on racial equity, parent voice, and safe reunification. We are excited about these changes, and are hopeful that this bill serves as a step toward creating a more holistic and equitable system of care for WA's infants, toddlers, and families. - We are deeply grateful for the strong community support in moving this through the legislature. We can't thank everyone enough for their support, expert guidance, testimony, and encouragement!
- The Child Care for Working Families Act. Recently reintroduced by Senator Patty Murray (D-WA) and Representative Bobby Scott (D-VA), this bill supports families in accessing quality, affordable childcare. It also invests in high-quality infant and toddler programs, increases training to early childhood educators and supports to mental health consultants. Site Updates

- Sites continue to rollout the foundations for their local baby court, and with the Community Coordinator Academy winding down, some SBCT courts are set to launch over the coming months! Spokane County has set a target start date for early May, and Thurston County expects to start hearing cases shortly thereafter. Kitsap has continued to develop their implementation process while hiring for a new Community Coordinator position.
- Some exciting updates from Pierce County's Best for Babies Program. Firstly, The Pierce County Council unanimously approved a \$20,000 award to the Best for Babies Program! The County Council discussion is here, beginning at 1:03 This will maintain funding through 2021, as the HRSA grant ends in September. Additionally, Best for Babies was featured in The News Tribune this month, spotlighting the impact of baby courts in Pierce County. - The State Leadership Team continues to focus on the development of the State Advisory Board. This group will provide broad oversight, guidance, and advocacy to local and statewide SBCT expansion efforts, centering equity and parent perspective throughout. Over the month, the State Team consulted with other states that have developed Advisory Boards to help clarify the Board's overall role and identify stakeholder representation that should participate. Next steps include outlining clear roles and responsibilities, and outreaching potential Board members.
