Legislative Success!

2SSB 5331 has been signed into WA law! We are excited to share that 2SSB 5331 successfully made its way through this legislative session! On May 12, Governor Inslee signed 2SSB 5331 into law, effective 7/25/21.

2SSB 5331 creates a statewide standard of practice for early childhood court programs, putting racial equity, parent voice, relationships, and safe reunification at the forefront of practice and service delivery. The passage of this bill into law is a necessary and promising step in our work toward creating a more equitable, holistic systems response for infants, toddlers, and their families in the child welfare system.

We want to again share our deep gratitude for the dedicated support you provided throughout this session. It has been inspiring to see the momentum across our state in favor of this bill. 2SSB 5331 could not have passed out of the legislature without this amazing group of advocates. THANK YOU!

SBCT Updates

Site Updates

Spokane is serving their first Baby Court case! Spokane County formally launched their Baby Court in May and has already welcomed their first family into the court program. Spokane continues to engage with their local community partners to streamline collaborative efforts and service delivery.



Thurston and Kitsap Counties have both experienced staffing changes with their Community Coordinators and are in the process of hiring for the positions. Both teams have met significant milestones in SBCT rollout and are eager to take cases once their Community Coordinator is hired and trained.

The Pierce County Best for Babies Program met with their Community Advisory Team this month, highlighting the importance of engaging and supporting fathers who are dependency-involved, expecting, or incarcerated. The work of a local Fatherhood Engagement program was presented, which <u>can be viewed here</u>. HRSA grant funding has been extended! We have been notified that the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) funding will be extended for one year. This means that the awards granted to sites (Kitsap, Thurston, Spokane, and Pierce Counties) will be renewed for an additional year, from September 2021-22.

Development of the WA Safe Babies State Advisory Board continues. Working in collaboration with ZTT, the purpose and key responsibilities of the Board have been established, and we expect to engage potential members later this summer. The WA Safe Babies State Advisory Board is a high-level, decision-making group that spans the state's child welfare system and community partners, leveraging their expertise in early childhood services to inform the state's SBCT efforts. Equity, reunification, and parent empowerment will be centered throughout the Board's efforts.
